## Best Recipes: Bacon Appetizer Crescents

---

- 1 pkg. (8 oz.) PHILADELPHIA Cream Cheese, softened
- 8 slices OSCAR MAYER Bacon, crisply cooked, crumbled
- 1/3 cup KRAFT 100% Grated Parmesan Cheese
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 Tbsp. chopped fresh parsley
- 1 Tbsp. milk
- 2 cans (8 oz. each) refrigerated crescent dinner rolls



**PREHEAT** oven to 375°F. Mix cream cheese, bacon, Parmesan cheese, onions, parsley and milk until well blended; set aside.

**SEPARATE** each can of dough into four rectangles; firmly press perforations together to seal. Spread each rectangle with 2 rounded tablespoons of the cream cheese mixture. Cut each rectangle into 12 wedges. Roll up wedges, starting at short ends. Place, seam-sides down, on greased baking sheet.

**BAKE** 12 to 15 min. or until golden brown. Serve warm.
